Despite the challenge of having to perform surgeries using light from their cell phones or flashlights—not to mention the constant threat of random gunfire—their dedication to saving lives never faltered. “It’s easy to label the Alghams as terrorists,” says Vince (standing), a cardiothoracic surgeon at Kenilworth Medical Center in Lakewood, New Jersey. “But I see them as people who need health care just like the rest of us.” Vance, a urologist at Stony Brook University Hospital, says, “As we were growing up, when people implied that we wouldn’t succeed in accomplishing our goals, we used that doubt as a catalyst to deny the odds and to help others do the same.”
